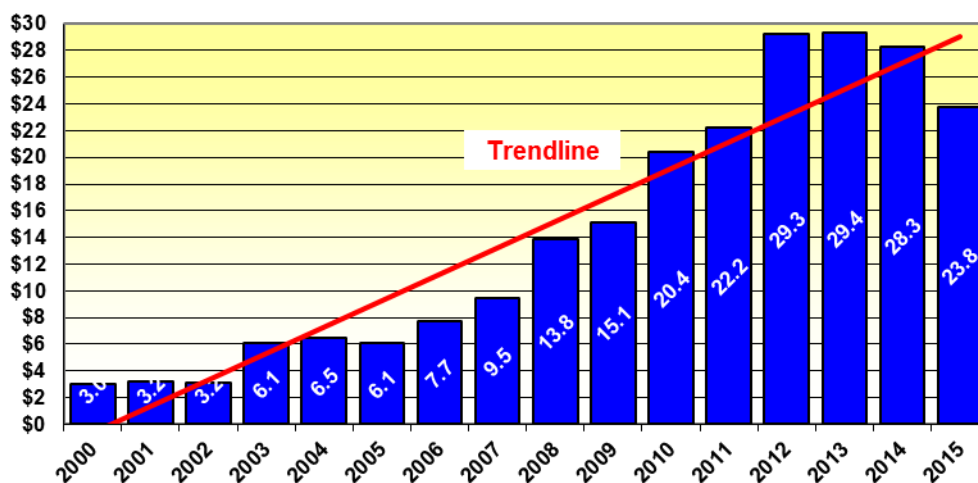


CHINA: TOP MARKET FOR U.S. AG EXPORTS

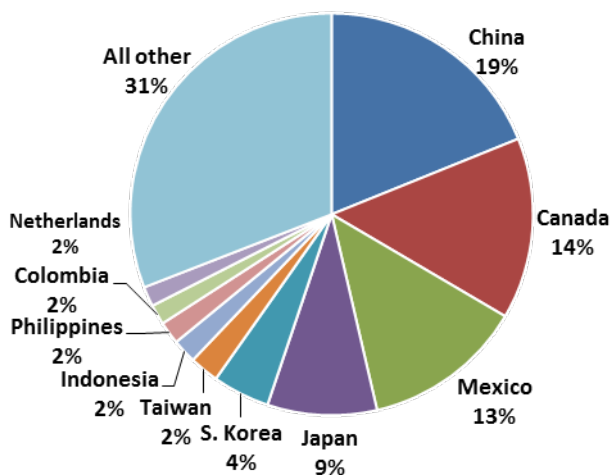
- China (including mainland, Hong Kong, and Macau) is the **largest** export market for U.S. agricultural products.
- In 2015, U.S. agricultural exports to China reached **\$23.8 billion**, nearly **one-fifth** of U.S. total agricultural exports.
- From 2000 to 2015, U.S. agricultural exports to China increased by **700%**.
- **Soybeans and products** are China's **No. 1** agricultural import from the U.S., with a 44% market share.
- China is among the top export markets for U.S. major ag commodities:
 - No. 1 in soybeans, feed, animal hides, DDG;
 - No. 2 in hay;
 - No. 3 in dairy and poultry; and
 - No. 5 in pork, beef, and processed food.

U.S. Agricultural Exports to China: 2000-2015 (Billion \$)



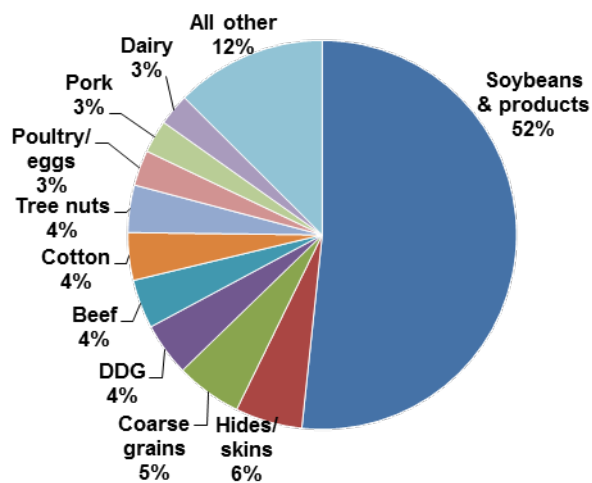
U.S. Ag Exports: Top Markets

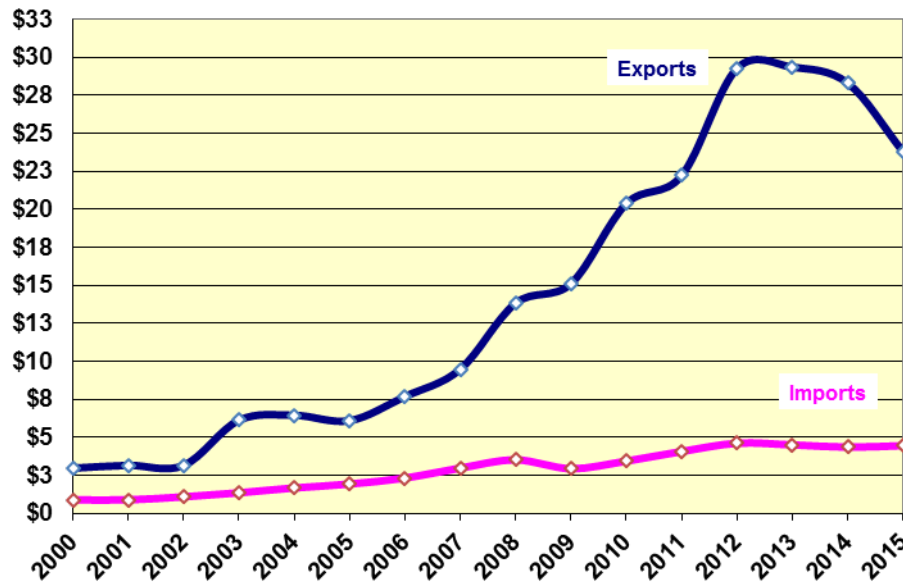

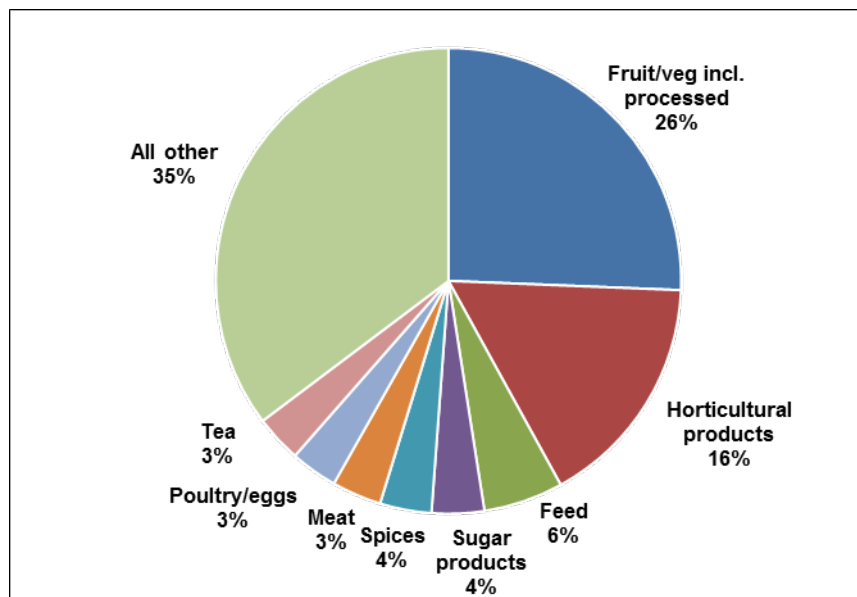
U.S. AG IMPORTS FROM CHINA

- The U.S. imported \$4.5 billion in agricultural products from China in 2015.
- The top U.S. import commodities from China are fruits and vegetables (fresh/processed), horticultural products, and feed – the combined which accounts for nearly one-half of the total U.S. ag imports from China.
