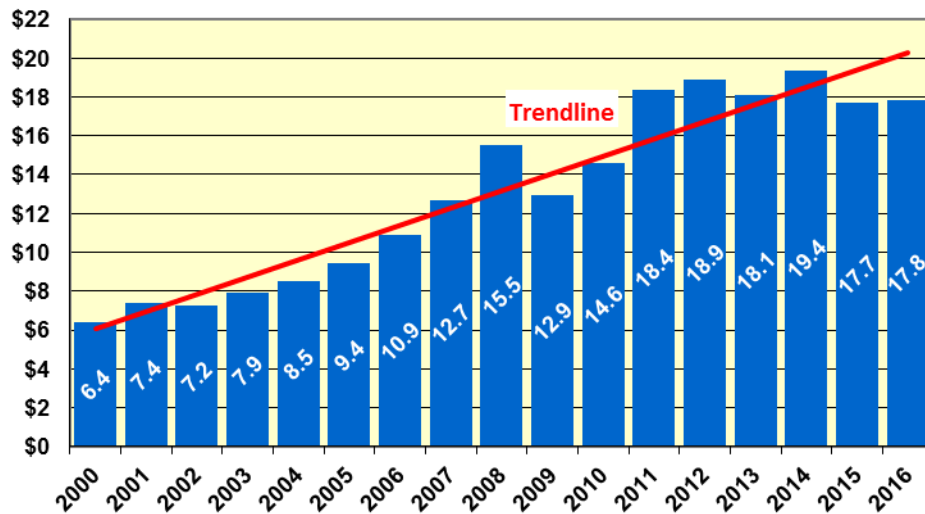


U.S. Agricultural Exports to Mexico

- Mexico is a fast growing agricultural market. It has the 11th largest population in the world – over 120 million people.
- In 2016, U.S. agricultural exports to Mexico topped \$17.8 billion, which is about 13% of the U.S. total agricultural exports to the world.
- Since 2000, U.S. agricultural exports to Mexico increased from **\$6.4 billion** (2000) to **\$17.8 billion** (2016), representing a **178%** growth rate.
- **Corn** is Mexico’s **No. 1** agricultural import from the U.S., followed by **soybeans** and **pork**.
- Mexico is among the top export markets for U.S. major ag commodities:
 - No. 1 for corn, dairy, soybean meal, poultry, and turkey;
 - No. 2 for soybeans, pork, processed foods, wheat, barley, and DDG;
 - No. 3 for total ag exports, beef, oats; and
 - No. 4 for feed.

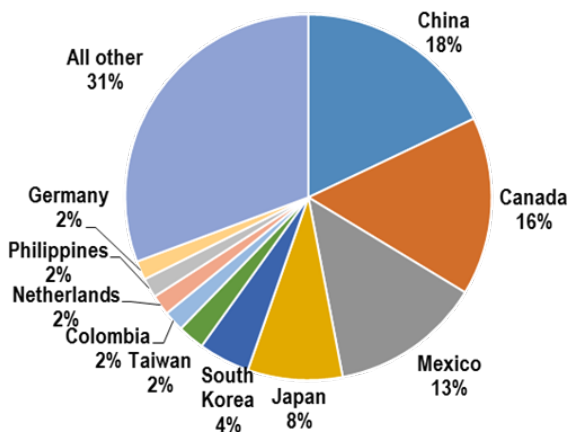
U.S. Agricultural Exports to Mexico: 2006-2016

(Billion \$)



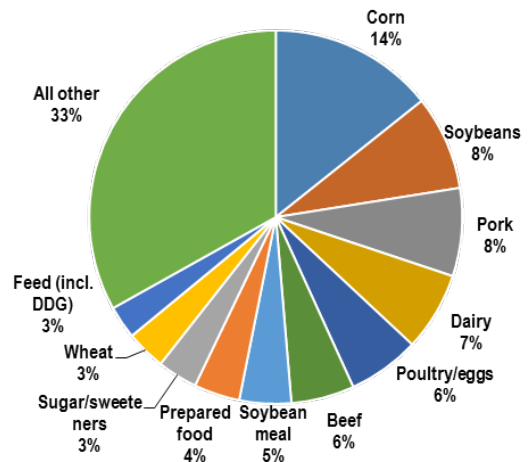
U.S. Ag Exports: Top Markets

(% share by value)

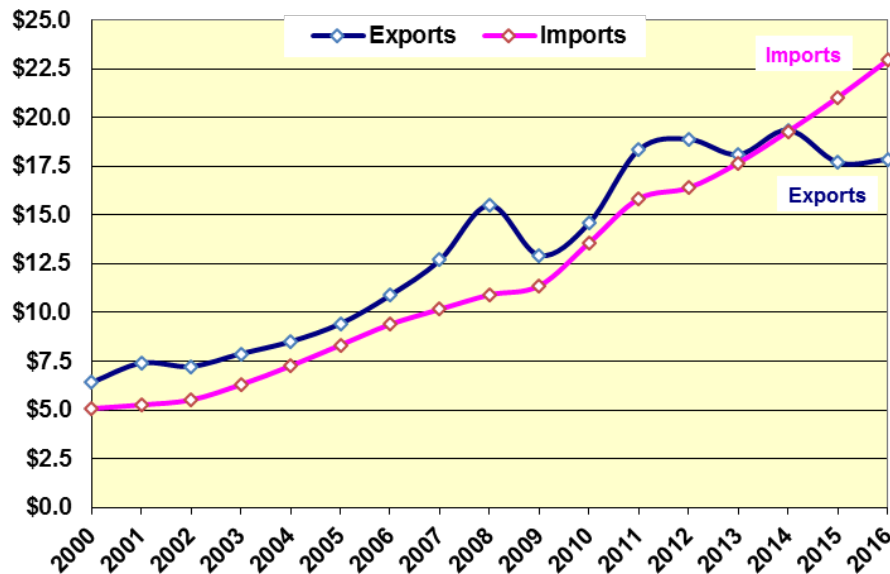


U.S. Agricultural Imports from Mexico

- The U.S. imported \$23 billion in agricultural products from Mexico in 2016, a 9% increase from 2015.
- The top U.S. import commodities from Mexico are vegetables and fruit, wine & beer, and snack foods – accounting for 75% of the total U.S. ag imports from Mexico.
- Since 2000, the growth trend of U.S. ag imports from Mexico mostly follows that of the U.S. ag exports to Mexico, except in 2015 and 2016, when U.S. ag imports from Mexico outpaced exports.

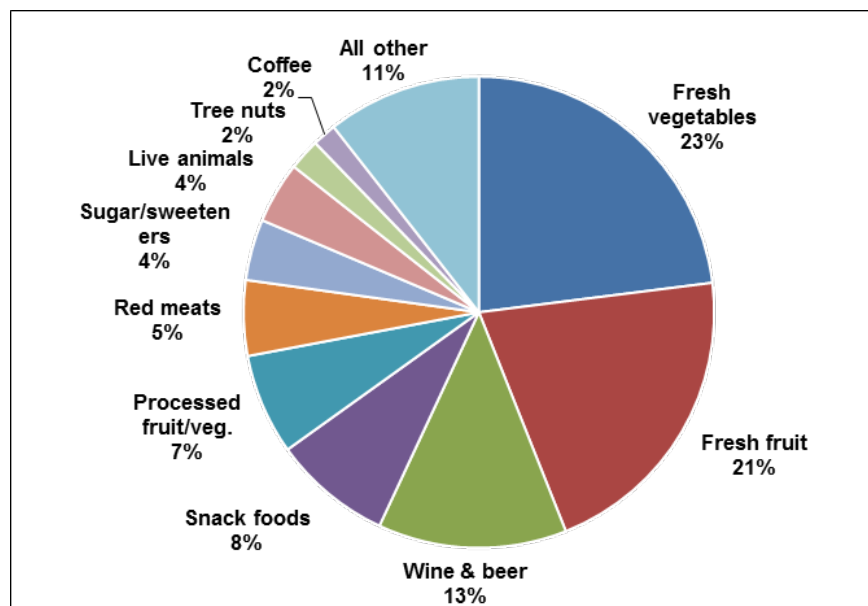
U.S. Agricultural Trade with Mexico – Export and Import
